# rindus slackbot documentation

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Introduction

This document will help to get the rindus slackbot into place.

We are using Slack for our teams to communicate and additionally it helps us in automating

- information propagation/aggregation
- process initiation/monitoring

in combination with this automata.

## Features

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## Installation

#### Install the rindus slackbot by running

git clone https://github.com/RindusIoTJam/slackbot.git
virtualenv venv
source venv/bin/activate
pip install -r requirements.txt

## 4.1 Production setup

You set the Slack bot token in the config file

Listing 1: settings.json

```
"slackbot.token": "XXXX-325920249586-tkG2oNbZ1oMrsjvkeVesRs04",

"plugins": [
    "#-- BotMaster Commands ------",
    "BotMasterCommands",
    "#-- Direct Commands ------",
    "BotInfoCommand",
    "CurrentCalendarCommand",
    "CurrentTimeCommand",
    "RandomJokeCommand",
    "#-- Channel Commands ------"
]
```

and simply start the slackbot with

```
python app.py
```

The help command is the only build-in command of the bot.

**Caution:** If the BotMasterCommands plugin is enabled, then you should as soon as possible open a direct chat with the bot and enter the following chat messages (replacing @bot with the @ and the bots name:

```
@bot !botchan !register
```

The first message this DM between you and the bot as a channel where you don't have to put @bot in front of all commands. The second command registers your SlackID as the ID that has BotMaster rights.

### 4.2 Development setup

You can create a local\_settings.json file, that is git ignored and just consists of one relevant line staring with slackbot.token. It is anyway overwriting every setting made in the settings.json with the settings made there.

Listing 2: local\_settings.json

```
{
   "slackbot.token": "xoxo-393952263286-sRsuiTOM645vtkGxoNbZkeVe"
}
```

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### Command Line Interface

You can use the CLI to send a message to a channel by for example crontab.

#### CLI parameters help

```
/opt/slackbot/venv/bin/python app.py -h
```

#### Example:

```
/opt/slackbot/venv/bin/python app.py --convo G0124GFUAQY
--message "Tür -> door"
--emoji "de"
--username "German Word Bot"
```

**Plugins** 

### 6.1 Abstract

Plugins extend the functionality of the bot. They are configured at the settings.json by adding the plugin name to the plugins list. There are 4 types of plugins:

- Channel Commands: Given in a channel in the form word:
- $\bullet$  Direct Commands: Given to the bot in the form  ${\tt @bot}\,$  word
- Botmaster Commands: Only available to the registered botmaster
- CommandSets: A bundle of commands of whatever type

### 6.1.1 Plugins

#### **BotMasterCommands**

Type:

CommandSet of Botmaster commands

#### Adds the commands

- !botchan
- !register
- !quit

!botchan: Messaging the bot in a direct chat @bot !botchan registers that channel as the one the botmaster uses to communicate with the bot without the need of prefixing direct commands with @bot.

!register: Registers your Slack ID as the botmaster who is authorized to give botmaster commands.

!quit: Instantly but graceful quit the bot.

#### RandomJokeCommand

Type:

Direct Command

#### Adds the command

• joke

Get you a random joke from https://geek-jokes.sameerkumar.website/api (mostly Chuck Norris jokes)

#### CurrentCalendarCommand

Type:

Direct Command

#### Adds the command

• calendar

Gives back a calendar of the current year.

#### CurrentTimeCommand

Type:

Direct Command

#### Adds the command

• calendar

Tells the bots local date and time in ISO 8601 format, YYYY-MM-DDTHH:MM:SS.
